

## **Responses from Ilaria Allegrozzi (Human Rights Watch) Follow-up to Webinar 1**

Are you still banned from traveling to Cameroon? And following the visit of the HRW Central Africa Director to Yaounde, has the Cameroonian government revoked access to HRW again after your Ngarbuh report?

**Since our Director was in Yaoundé in late January, I did not have the chance to ask for a visa because of the travel ban imposed by the Covid-19 pandemic.**

You have been attacked both by the Ambazonians and by the Government. What Ambazonian actors do you see as the largest obstacle to progress such as Chris Anu, Cho Ayaba, Akwanga, etc.?

**We think a major obstacle for a lasting solution to the Anglophone crisis as a whole is impunity. Addressing impunity for serious crimes committed in the NW and SW by both government forces and armed separatists could represent a first step in addressing the crisis.**

Has the UNSC been lobbied to bring the war on the agenda?

**We and others did advocate upon the UN SC to take a more in depth look at the Anglophone crisis. We have called on the UN SC to formally add Cameroon to its agenda as a regular stand-alone item. See, among others:**
